# About Langkawi, Malaysia

### Language

Bahasa Malaysia is the official language. But English is widely spoken and understood.

#### **Climate**

Although Langkawi falls into the tropical weather zone, but unlike many other parts of Malaysia, it enjoys far more sunshine, dry spells and a stable weather. February is the hottest month in Langkawi with an average temperature of 29°C (84°F) and the coldest is July at 27°C (81°F) with the most daily sunshine hours at 9 in June. The wettest month is October with an average of 344mm of rain. The best month to swim in the sea is in April when the average sea temperature is 30°C (86°F).

### **Currency & Banking**

Ringgit is the official currency, but some resorts and establishments do accept other notes or offer foreign exchange (check with them for the service). The current exchange rate is around RM3.70 to USD 1.00 – but, consult banks for the latest exchange rates prior to your trip. Kuah town and the airport is where you will find most of the banks and money-changers. Banks open daily from 09:30 to 15:30. On Thursdays, they are open from 09:30 to 12:00 and are closed on Saturdays.

#### **Time Differences**

Malaysia is 8 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+8). No Daylight Saving Time is practiced in Malaysia.

#### **Electricity Supply**

Electricity is supplied at 240V 50Hz. The power socket use in Malaysia are of type G.
